

AP Computer Science A Summer Work Ramapo-Indian Hills

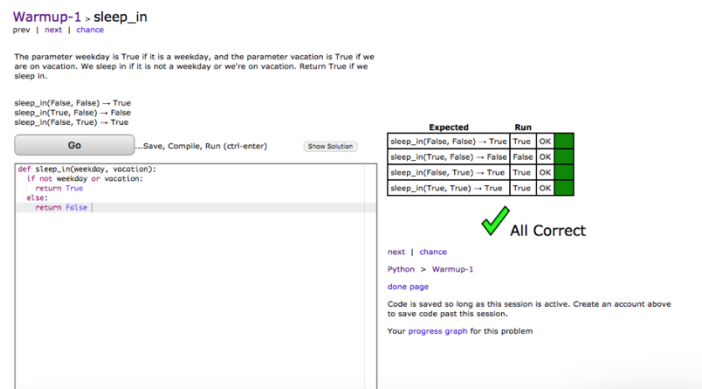
This packet is required work for all students signed up for AP Computer Science A. It will be due soon after school starts in September.
