This summer you have the opportunity to set-up your year to be a great success by completing at least six summer assignments.

WHAT IS THE AP ART COURSE ABOUT?

The AP Studio Art courses are designed for students who are seriously interested in the practical experience of art. AP Courses and portfolios emphasize challenging, research-based curricula aligned with higher education expectations.

As in any college-level course, it is expected that

you will spend a considerable amount of time outside the classroom working on completion of assignments. Ideas for projects or solutions to problems should be worked out in a sketchbook both in class and outside of class. This is the most rigorous art course, so expect to work independently, work hard in and out of class, and grow as an artist.

INSTRUCTIONAL GOALS OF THE COURSE

- (1) Conduct a sustained investigation through practice, experimentation, & revision
- (2) Skillfully synthesize materials, processes, and ideas, and
- (3) Articulate, in writing, information about one's work.

In this course, we will continually address your ability to recognize the quality of your work, your sustained investigation of a particular visual interest or problem and your visual demonstration of your range of approaches to art making (composition and technique)

AP ART SUMMER PACKET

The AP Art and Design program consists of three different AP Portfolio Exams.

- AP 2D Art and Design
- AP 3D Art and Design
- AP Drawing

In September, we will discuss the differences in the exams and you will determine how you would like your work assessed.



Your art for the AP ART Exam should be guided by inquiry-based questions.

Get in the habit of asking questions for your summer assignments so it is a habit in September.

Talk about the elements & principles in your art when you show it.

Your summer assignments are your 1st pieces for your portfolio. Revise and rework assignments until they meet your standards.

SUSTAINED INVESTIGATION: HOW IS THE EXAM SCORED?

The Sustained Investigation is 60% of the portfolio exam score

Submit 15 images that demonstrate:

- Sustained investigation through practice, experimentation, & revision
- Sustained investigation of materials, processes, & ideas
- Synthesis of materials, processes, & ideas
- 2D/3D/Drawing skills

State the following in writing:

- · Identify the questions that guided your sustained investigation
- Describe how your sustained investigation shows evidence of practice, experimentation, and revision guided by your questions

Identify the • Materials used • Processes used • Size for each image

SELECTED WORKS: HOW IS THE EXAM SCORED?

The Sustained Investigation is 40% of the portfolio exam score

Submit five works that demonstrate:

· Synthesis of materials, processes, and ideas

For each work, state the following in writing:

- Idea(s) visually evident (100 characters)
- · Materials used, Processes used

The Selected Works are prepared and physically sent to the College Board reviewers. Five images are selected to be scored.

The Selected Works can be no larger that 18"x24"

Consider the 4 C's for every AP ART assignment:

Craftsmanship/Technique: The development of artistic skill/control over art materials through deliberation and attention to detail.

Composition: Intentionally organizing art elements using the art principles to create a visually unified design.

Communication: Applying art knowledge and skill to express, identify, and evaluate ideas and feelings in artwork.

Creative Process: An approach to solving problems and expressing ideas in unique and personal ways.

- Complete the "Before starting your art piece" section for each summer assignment
- Finish one art piece. (The art piece should be something you are verty proud of.

This means you might need to make more than one piece to make something that is excellent.)


FINAL ART SUMMER ASSIGNMENTS ARE DUE SEPTEMBER 9, 2022

- Three progress photographs for each of the summer assignments.
- All six summer assignments should be completed and polished.
- Complete "After completing your assignment" for each summer assignment prompt in a sketchbook

As artists, it is important for us to be able to think critically and be able to articulate our work to others.

Questions you should ask yourself:

	What is the BIG IDEA in this art piece?
0	What is the BIG IDEA in this body of work?
	What MATERIALS are being used?
	What process did you explore while
0	creating your art?



Consider:

How do you approach different concepts, materials?

How do you respond to the world around you?

How do you use your unique life experience & connection to the world in the art you create?

In Addition to making art, there will be...

Analysis and Interpretation: Looking at comtemporary and historical artists and their body of work, and relate findings with student work.

Peer-to-Peer Dialogue: Student artists will engage in critiques and share/respond to ideas

Reflective Writing: Students articulate ideas throughout the creative process (journal/diary/sketchbook)

Before starting your art piece...

- 2. Write a list of at least 5 things you notice are visually prominent in the works you researched
- 3. Write a sentence in your process journal about the context for the historical art
- 4. Sketch some ideas.
- 5. Draw 3 compositional thumbnail sketches
- 6. Select the most dynamic composition to develop

#2: Emotional: PORTRAIT OR FIGURATIVE IMAGE

Create a portrait or figurative image with strong emotion.

What amplifies emotion? Consider exaggerated value, color, forms, light/shadow, atmospheric perspective, focus/blurriness.



- 2. List 5 creative decisions that are evident in the researched images.
- 3. Sketch at least 3 ideas.

- Include value/ tones.
- The minimum size is 11"x14"
- No name/signature on front.

Before starting your art piece...

- 1. Try different set-ups. Walk around the set-up and find the most interesting angle. Take photos.
- 2. Draw 3 compositional thumbnail sketches.
- 3. Try a close-up, try looking at it from above, shine a strong light to change the light and shadows.
- 6. Select the most dynamic composition to develop.
